Four Keys to Becoming an Unstoppable Church! Unstoppable, Pt. 10

1 Thessalonians 5:12-14, March 17. 2024

1 Thessalonians 1:1, Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you. 2 We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. 3 We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Thessalonians 5:12, Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. 13 Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. 14 And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 15 Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else.

Four Keys to Becoming an Unstoppable Church:

1. The Church Honors Its <u>LEADERS</u>

1 Thessalonians 5:12, Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. 13 Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work.

Hebrews 13:15, Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that openly profess his name. 16 And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased. 17 Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you.

2. The Leaders Love and Lead The CONGREGATION

1 Thessalonians 5:12, Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. 13 Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work.

<u>1 Peter 5:2</u>, Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, <u>watching over them</u>—not because you <u>must</u>, but because you are <u>willing</u>, as God wants you to be; <u>not pursuing dishonest gain</u>, but <u>eager to serve</u>; <u>3 not lording it over those</u> entrusted to you, but being <u>examples</u> to the flock. <u>4</u> And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.

Ephesians 4:11, So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, 12 to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up 13 until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

<u>James 3:1</u>, Not many of you should become teachers, my fellow believers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly.

3. The Church and Leaders Know How to Get ALONG

1 Thessalonians 5:13, ... Live in peace with each other.

Philippians 2:2, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

4. The Church Deals Properly with Challenging PEOPLE

1 Thessalonians 5:14, And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 15 Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else.

Ephesians 4:31, Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. 32 Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.
